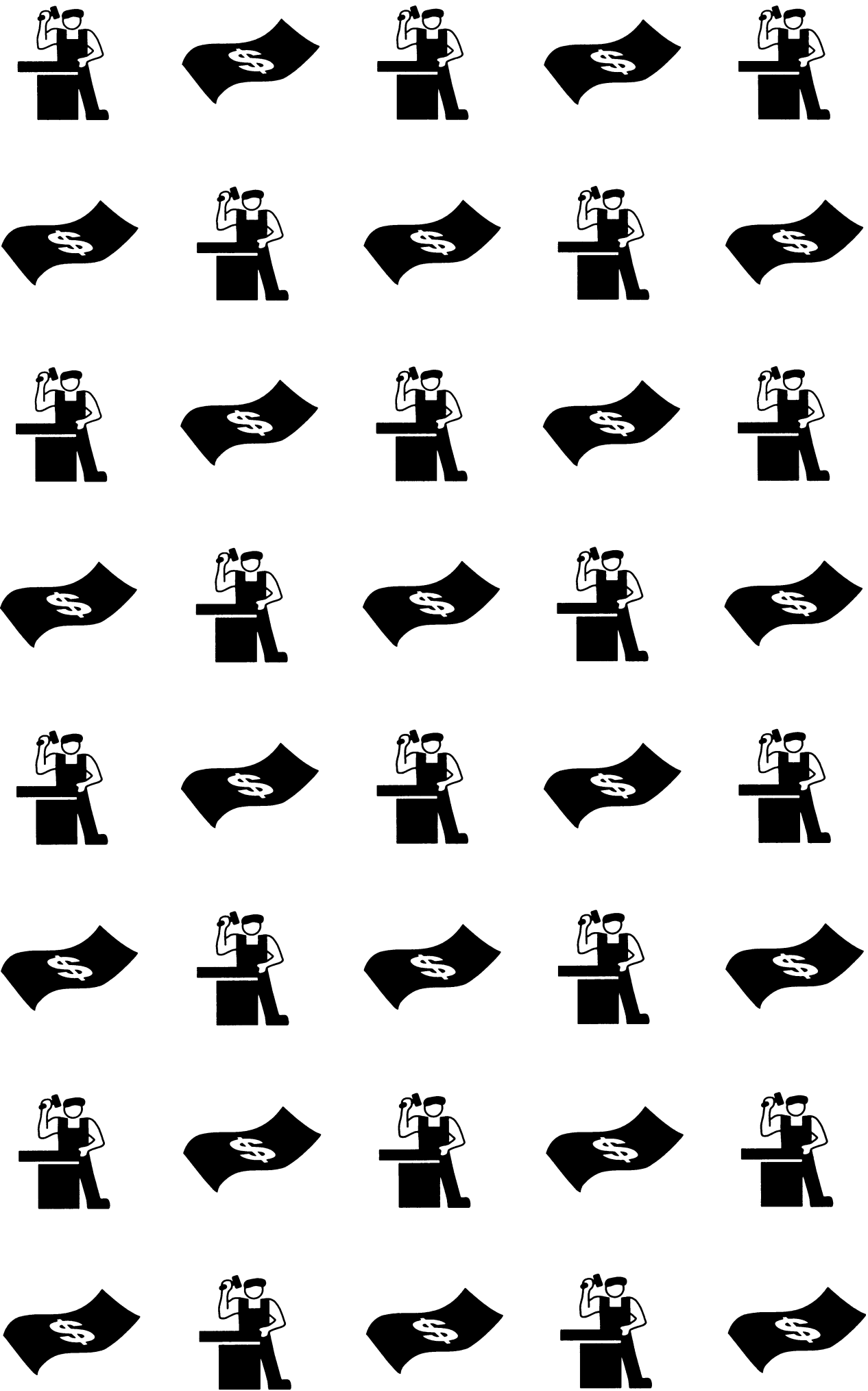

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## Section 9

### FINANCE & LABOR

Part one of this section presents statistics on the financial institutions on Maui. Part two includes figures for Maui County's labor force.

The civilian labor force for 1999 was 71,650 and the number of employed was 67,550. The unemployment rate declined 1.1% between 1998 and 1999.

Data for this section came from the Hawaii State Department of Business, Economic Development and Tourism, the Hawaii Credit Union League, the Hawaii Department of Industrial Labor and Relations and the Hawaii Employer's Council.
