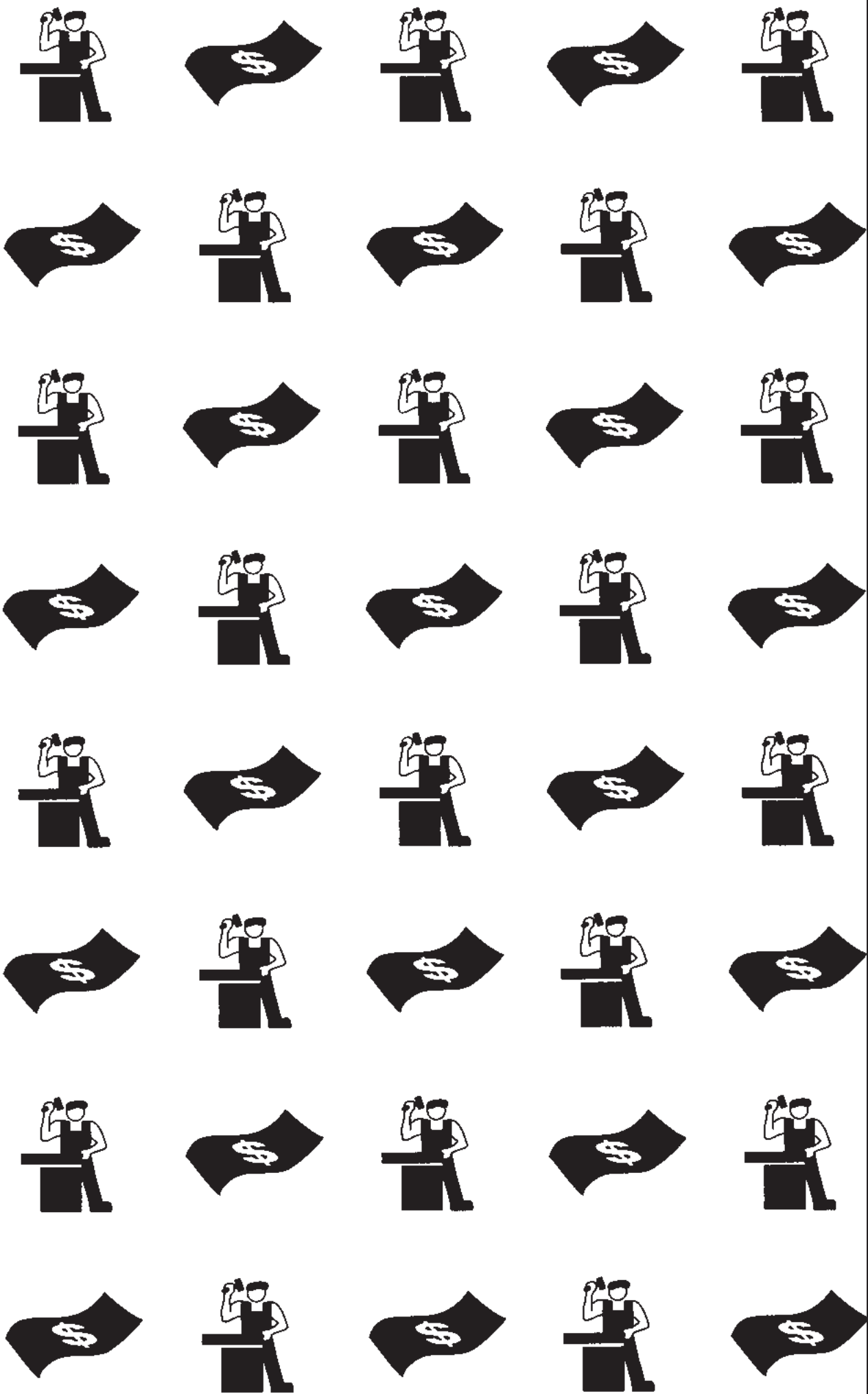

FINANCE & LABOR

Part one of this section presents statistics on the financial institutions on Maui. Part two includes figures for Maui County's labor force.

The civilian labor force for 2006 was 77,100 and the number of employed was 75,350. The unemployment rate decreased 0.3% between 2005 and 2006.

Data for this section came from the Hawai'i State Department of Business, Economic Development and Tourism, the Hawaii Credit Union League, and the Hawai'i Department of Industrial Labor and Relations.
