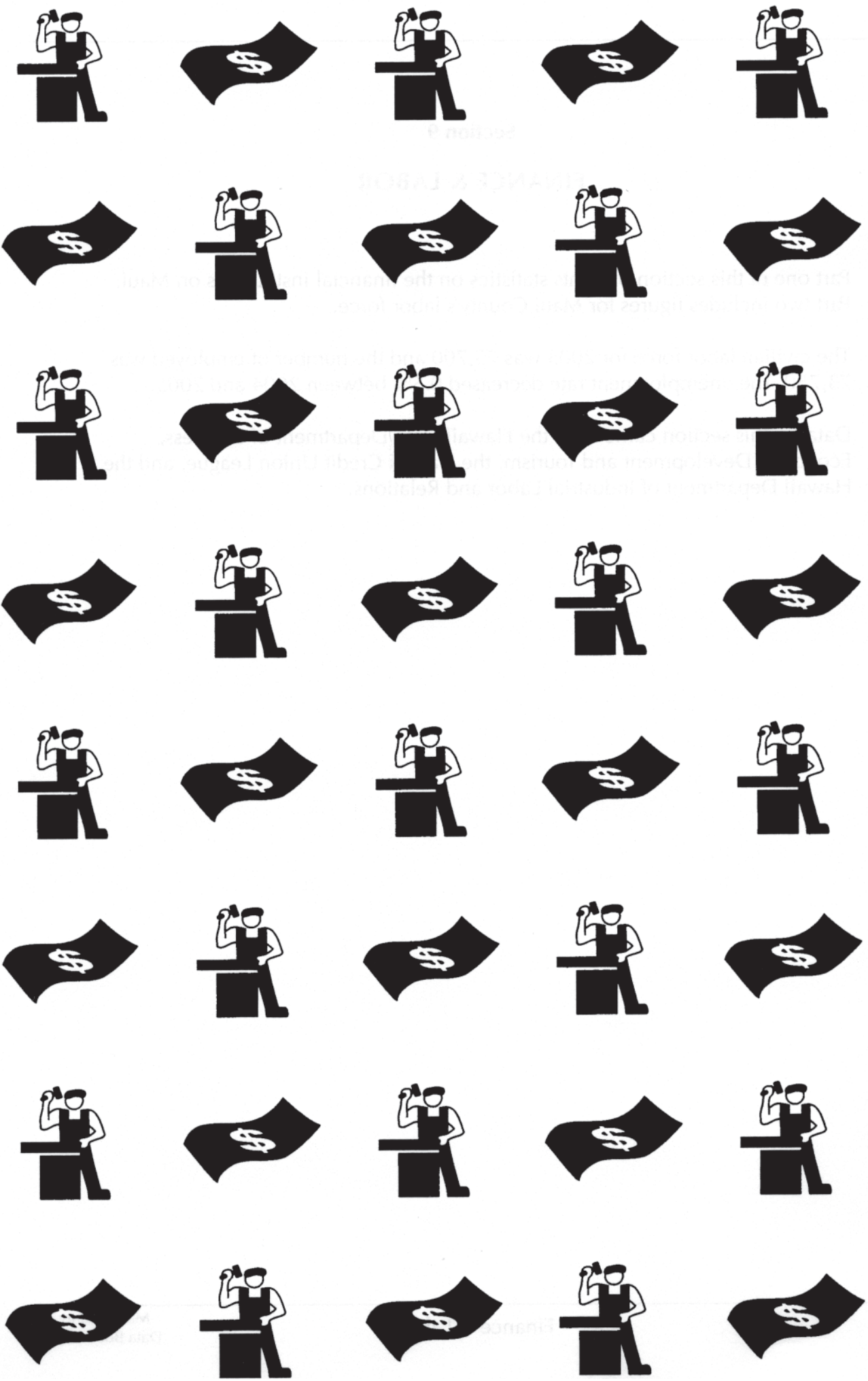

FINANCE & LABOR

Part one of this section presents statistics on the financial institutions on Maui. Part two includes figures for Maui County's labor force.

The civilian labor force for 2007 was 79,700 and the number of employed was 7,450. The unemployment rate increased 0.3% between 2006 and 2007.

Data for this section came from the Hawai'i State Department of Business, Economic Development and Tourism, the Hawaii Credit Union League, and the Hawai'i Department of Industrial Labor and Relations.
